Kasee Stratton, Ph.D., LP, NCSP- Mississippi State University

Dr. Stratton-Gadke is an assistant professor in the School Psychology Program in the Department of Counseling, Educational Psychology, and Foundations at Mississippi State University. She earned her Ph.D. in School Psychology from Central Michigan University. Dr. Stratton-Gadke completed her pre-doctoral and post-doctoral training at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and the Kennedy Krieger Institute's Department of Behavioral Psychology. Dr. Stratton-Gadke is a licensed psychologist, a nationally certified school psychologist, and a AAAA licensed school psychologist for the state of Mississippi. Dr. Stratton-Gadke has spent the last 12 years researching the behavioral phenotype for CHARGE Syndrome and has presented throughout the United States, Australia, New Zealand, and Denmark on CHARGE. At Mississippi State University, she directs the Bulldog CHARGE Syndrome Research Lab with the mission to improve the lives of individuals with CHARGE. Dr. Stratton specializes in treating challenging behavior and improving adaptive skills for children and adolescents with developmental disabilities.

Daniel Gadke earned his Ph.D. in School Psychology from Illinois State University and completed his pre-doctoral and post-doctoral work at Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine and the Kennedy Krieger Institute.
